



Stormwater Management Permit Procedures and Application

Upon review and approval of a Stormwater Management Permit (Article 21, Zoning Ordinance) the Newbury Code Enforcement will issue the permit and a Certificate of Zoning Compliance.

Frequently Asked Questions

When do I need a Stormwater Management Permit?

Stormwater Management Permits are required for any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate and/or where the natural vegetation has been removed exposing the underlying soil or vegetation has been covered by fill material, provided that any one of the following four criteria are met.

If your property is within 250' of the protected Shore Land Overlay District (Article 7) or any zoning district, your project requires Erosion control per Section 7.10 and 7.12.

- 1) The slope of the land before or after development is 15% or greater and the area to be disturbed is 1000 square feet or greater.
- 2) The slope of the land is less than 15%, and the area to be disturbed is 1000 square feet or greater and the disturbed area is 20 feet or less from the top of a slope of 15% or greater.

Are there any other permits I may need?

For tree-cutting in the Town of Newbury Shore Land Overlay District (Article 7 of the Newbury Zoning Ordinance), you need a tree-cutting permit, available through the Code Enforcement Officer.

State or federal permits may be required depending on the location of the project and the extent of land disturbance. The Code Enforcement Officer can assist you in determining which state or federal permits are required for your project.

Permits from NH Department of Environmental Services or US Environmental Protection Agency prior to construction.
