CHAPTER IV

COMMUNITY FACILITIES & SERVICES AND RECREATION

Recommendations: Town Buildings

- 1. The Town should retain the historical character of these buildings regardless of how they are used because they are a very important part of the cultural heritage of the community.
- 2. The Town should renovate the Old Town Hall in South Newbury for use as a function hall. It could host events and gatherings such as plays, dances and wedding receptions.
- 3. Sherman Hall in South Newbury should continue to be used by the Historical Society.
- 4. The Hearse House in South Newbury should remain unchanged and continue to add to the historical character of the village.
- 5. The gazebo, train station, caboose, and the information booth in Newbury harbor should all be retained and maintained.
- 6. The Town Office Building should be maintained.
- 7. After the Grange Hall in South Newbury is no longer used by the grange, the Town may want to consider using it for a museum.
- 8. The Selectboard should appoint a Committee to study the future use(s) for the Veteran's Hall. All alternatives should be evaluated in reaching a recommendation to the Selectboard. Costs associated with implementing the future use of the building and site should be incorporated into the Town's Capital Improvement Program.
- 9. The Selectboard should have a feasability study done of the Bald Sunapee property to see if it can accommodate the use for both a new police facility and a new community/senior center, possibly attached to the south side of the library. The existing house on the site is not useable and should be removed.
