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Newbury Energy Committee Recommendations

Newbury Energy was established as an advisory committee to identify opportunities for the town and its residents to reduce energy costs and adopt energy efficiency best practices.

Recommendation:

Install a solar array at the town's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) on Bowles Rd in Blodgett Landing, to save money for the town and invest in renewable energy





What Will It Look Like?









Who Will Pay For This?

The best option for the town is to sign a Power Purchase Agreement
 (PPA), where Investors put up the capital investment.

• What is a PPA?

 A financial agreement where the developer arranges for design, permitting, financing and installation of the solar energy system on town property for little or no cost. The committee went out to bid to multiple major vendors in NH and have selected **ReVision Energy**.

What's In It For Newbury? (immediate savings)

 If Newbury signed the contract today, it would save ~\$12k over the first 5 years of the 25yr contract.

The Investors will own the equipment and sell the energy to
 Newbury. The town will save on their Eversource bills with all the
 renewable energy generated by the solar array.





What's In It for Newbury? (long term potential)


• The town will have the opportunity for significant longer-term savings if, after 5 years, they choose to purchase the equipment.

 If the town were to buy the equipment outright after 5 years, the energy savings generated would cover the cost of a bond, so there would be no tax rate increase.






Potential Savings if we Buy The Equipment

• Warrant Article 10:

O To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectboard to enter into a 25-year Solar Power Purchase Agreement with an easement for ½ acre of town land at 365 Bowles Road, with an option to purchase after year 5, for the purpose of locating solar energy facilities, and for the Selectboard to purchase all the needed electrical energy produced by this facility at a reduced rate over the term of the agreement. This has no effect on the tax rate.
