Newbury Beautification Committee

As you drive through Town take notice of the hanging baskets, provided by Kathan Gardens, and the window boxes and barrels filled with colorful blooms all carefully chosen and cared for by NBC members. Every morning from May through September watch for our "flower power" watering cart as members take turns watering and feeding all the flowers. The cart now has a new light bar which has been installed for the safety of our volunteers who do the watering along 103 from the fire station to the harbor. And in South Newbury, NBC volunteers water the barrels at the ladder sign and in front of the three town owned buildings; Town Hall, Sherman Hall and the Grange. The sign had some damage due to wind and rain through the winter. The water damage was repaired, water-proofed and touch-up paint was applied. A committee of 5, Ted, Jones, Stu Hale, Mike Beaton, Steve Peterson and Dennis DeAppolonio, re-installed the sign. Thank you gentlemen.





Fire Department News

NH Fish and Game Safe Hiking Presentation was a Big Success.

Thirty-seven people packed the training room on May 17 at the Newbury Fire Station for Conservation Officer James Cyrs talk on being safe while hiking on Mount Sunapee and other hiking trails throughout the state.

Officer Cyrs discussed each of the ten steps of the Hike Safe code, gave details on several search and rescues that involved Fish and Game. Officer Cyrs demonstrated some of the rescue equipment that may be used and discussed the other agencies involved in searches. There were several questions from the audience that he answered, and he went over hiking websites where people could get additional information. The presentation was co-sponsored by the Newbury Fire Department and the Newbury Library.



Always let someone know where you will be and when you will return.

As was discussed in Officer Cyrs presentation and was very evident in a recent search and rescue call. Anyone hiking the trails or swimming or kayaking, paddle boarding, or windsurfing out on the water should always inform a relative or friend where they will be going and when they expect to return.

Recently Newbury Fire Rescue was requested to respond with a boat to Pleasant Lake in New London for a report of a missing swimmer, who had not been seen in two hours. The Newbury boat crew along with rescue boats from New London, Sunapee and Hanover searched the lake for close to an hour until one of the boats located the individual swimming in the center of the lake. The person was brought to shore, checked by the ambulance crew then reunited with their family. This incident turned out well and no one was hurt, but swimming calls do not always turn out this way. Please always keep others informed of your plans and time of return.

In an Emergency, If you Cannot Call, Text 911

There are trails on Mount Sunapee as well as parts of Newbury where there is no cell service or where cell service is poor, but texting 911 in an emergency will go through.

If you are in a situation when it isn't safe for you to speak, you are unable to speak or you have poor cell service, you can reach 911 via text. Just type "911" in the to field and you will be connected to one of the 911 expert telecommunicators who will text with you to connect you with the help you need. Please describe the nature and location of the emergency right away.



Fireworks Permits

Permits are required from Newbury Fire Rescue for all fireworks displays in the Town of Newbury. To apply for a fireworks permit, go online to the Newbury Fire Rescue website: www.newburyfd.org and in the green box at the top of the page click on "Fireworks Permit Request Form" fill out the information, which will be sent to the fire department. If you have been issued a fireworks permit in the past, you will receive a renewal permit confirmation by email. If this is your first permit application, you will be contacted to schedule an inspection of the fireworks display site to confirm that it meets the NH & Newbury Fireworks safety setback requirements. Once the satisfactory inspection is complete a fireworks permit will be issued. The date and location of fireworks permits that are issued are posted on the website. Please keep in mind that fireworks are not permitted after 10:00 PM in accordance with the Town of Newbury Noise ordinance.

Smoke Detectors have an Expiration Date

Did you know that if the smoke detectors in your home are over ten years old and the Carbon Monoxide (CO) detectors are over 7 years old they should be replaced. The newer smoke detectors with a sealed battery also need to be replaced after ten years. Each smoke detector has a date of manufacture on the back and by checking the label you can determine when replacement is needed. After the indicated number of years, the detectors lose their sensitivity and may not immediately sound as they are designed to smoke or carbon monoxide in the house.
